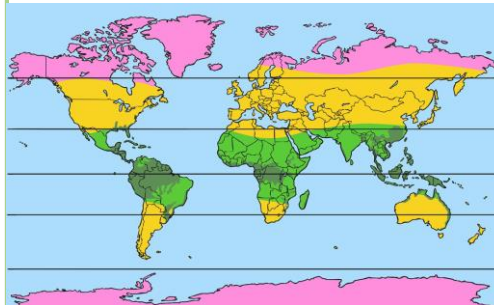
Important facts

Atlas - a book containing different maps.

Climate - the weather conditions in an area over a long period of time.

Compass directions - Showing direction using North, South, East and West.

Continent - a large area made up of different countries. The area is usually a large expanse of land but can be formed of many island countries.

Country - a nation with its own government

Equator - an imaginary line that divides the Earth into a North-ern and Southern Hemisphere.

Northern Hemisphere - the half of the Earth that is north of the equator.

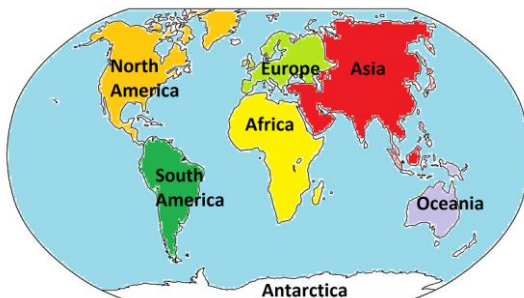
Southern Hemisphere - the half of the Earth that is south of the equator.

Map - a diagram representing an area of land or sea showing physical features, cities and roads .

Ocean - an expanse of salt water deeper and covering a larger area than a sea .

Temperate - A country or region with a mild climate.
