

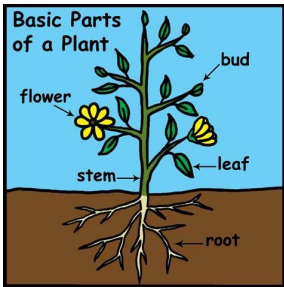
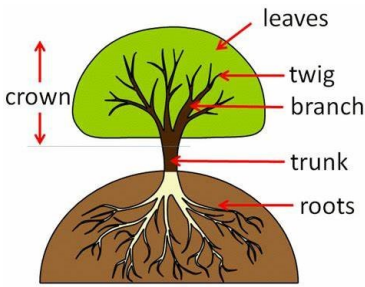

What should I already know?	Key Vocabulary
- Plants can grow. - Deciduous trees lose their leaves in the autumn and winter.	Branches, bulb, common, deciduous, evergreen, flower, flowering, fruit, garden, herb, leaf, leaves, petal, plant, roots, seed, stem, tree, trunk, vegetable, vegetation, weed, wild

What will I know by the end of this unit?	
- The names of some common garden plants:    Poppy Rose Sunflower - People may grow plants in their gardens and care for them. - They may grow flowering plants which are beautiful to look at or beans and seeds to grow plants for food. - When plants are grown for food, this may be called a herb garden or vegetable patch.	- The names of some common wild plants:    Dandelion Daisy Nettle - A wild plant will grow by itself. - It does not need to be cared for. - If it grows somewhere unwanted, it may be a weed.
Deciduous trees lose their leaves in the autumn every year. Their leaves are generally broad, flat and have veins running through them. Evergreen trees have green leaves all year round. Their leaves are generally thick, waxy and narrow like needles.	Basic Parts of a Plant
