

Holy Souls RC Primary School PE and Sports Premium Funding

The Government is providing funding to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision for PE and sport in schools. We will be held accountable for how we have used additional funding to support pupils progress and participation in PE and school sport. We are required to publish on-line information about how we have used the additional funding, including details about our sporting provision alongside curriculum details. This will ensure that parents/carers and others are made fully aware of the PE and sporting provision at Holy Souls RC Primary School.
